### PUPIL PREMIUM STRATEGY 2018-2019

#### How is the Pupil Premium Calculated?

The School Census taken in January of each year looked at three categories of students:

- Students who were 'Ever 6 Free School Meals' (any child who at any time during the last 6 years was claiming free school meals)
- Looked After Children (in the care of the Local Authority or adopted)
- Students whose parents are serving in the Armed Forces

Depending on which category is appropriate for the child this will generate either £1,900, £1,320 or £300.

If you believe you are eligible for Free School Meals and are not currently claiming for this benefit your child will not attract this additional funding. If you require assistance in claiming this benefit please contact the Harvey Road School Office or the Local Authority.

This represents 2% of the pupil population at Harvey Road School. The intention is to use the funding as a means by which we can support the overall development of these children. This could be through academic initiatives and/or interventions as well as emotional, social or behavioural.

#### Aims for 2018-2019

1. To support the progress of disadvantaged pupils so that they are closing the gap against Non-Pupil premium children at Harvey Road School
2. Disadvantaged children attain as well as non-disadvantaged children nationally
3. To close the gap between attainment between disadvantaged children at Harvey Road School and non-disadvantaged children at Harvey Road School
4. To build self-confidence, self-esteem and the belief that making mistakes is a learning opportunity

To achieve the above aims we will be doing the following:
