PUPIL PREMIUM STRATEGY 2019-2020

AIM

To support the progress of disadvantaged pupils so that they are closing the gap against non-disadvantaged children.

Disadvantaged pupils – A definition.

The Department for Education identifies disadvantaged pupils as:

'Eligible for Free School Meals or have been in the last six years; Looked After Children (LAC), or those who have previously looked after by the state, but are now adopted or are subject to a special guardianship order, a child arrangements order or a residence order; Children with parents in the armed forces.

It is assumed that these children are disadvantaged in comparison to others because of low family income, little or no family support (LAC) or lots of school moves all of which have been proven to have a negative impact on progress and attainment when compared to others.

The Government provides funding, the Pupil Premium, to allow schools to put interventions into place to try to close the gap between disadvantaged pupils and their peers.

How is the Pupil Premium Calculated?

The School Census taken in January of each year looked at three categories of students:

- Students who were 'Ever 6 Free School Meals' (any child who at any time during the last 6 years was claiming free school meals)
- Looked After Children (in the care of the Local Authority or adopted)
- Students whose parents are serving in the Armed Forces

Depending on which category is appropriate for the child this will generate either £1,900, £1,320 or £300.

If you believe you are eligible for Free School Meals and are not currently claiming for this benefit your child will not attract this additional funding. If you require assistance in claiming this benefit please contact the Harvey Road School Office or the Local Authority.

This represents **0.8%** of the pupil population at Harvey Road School. The intention is to use the funding as a means by which we can support the overall development of these children. This could be through academic initiatives and/or interventions as well as emotional, social or behavioural support.

Harvey Road School Priorities for 2019-2020

1. Provide One to One tuition for the KS 2 Pupil Premium Child
2. Set up nurture support systems that provide targeted pastoral support
3. Provide extension and enrichment activities for the KS 2 Pupil Premium Child
4. Use assessment systems to track disadvantaged children

To achieve the above priorities we will be doing the following:
